



The earliest you can apply for the student visa from your home country is 6 months before you start your course. You'll usually get a decision on your visa within 3 weeks.

Below given is a list of deliverables that needs to be submitted while applying for a UK student visa.

- 1) CAS (Confirmation of acceptance of studies) letter from the university
- 2) Offer letter
- 3) Passport
- 4) All academic records
- 5) Work Experience Certificates, if it may apply
- 6) Name affidavit, if it may apply
- 7) Proof that you have sufficient funds to cover your course costs (tuition fees) and your financial requirement (money to support yourself).
 - Bank account statement or
 - Loan letter from the bank (Whichever that applies)

Cost

Your *financial requirement* (money to support yourself) depends on where you'll be attending school. You'll require one of the following:

- London courses cost £1,334 per month for a maximum of nine months.
- Courses outside of London cost £1,023 per month (for a maximum of nine months).

Applying for a student visa from outside the UK costs £363.

The annual *visa fee for the immigration health surcharge is currently £624*.

If the application is for a student visa, a Youth Mobility Scheme visa, or the applicant for any visa is under the age of eighteen at the time of their immigration application, the *immigration health surcharge fee is lowered to £470 per year*.

Since the charges can change at any time, it is ideal to set aside at least £1000 if your programme duration is one year and up to £1700 for two years.
